The Pledge was led by Immediate Past President Marty Lockard, the song "Take Me Out to the Ball Game" led by Lion Huey Sullivan, and Invocation was given by Lion Jeff Root. The song was most appropriate, as July 17th was the night of the 2018 Major League Baseball All-Star game in Washington DC.

The meal featured beef stew and shrimp alfredo, along with rice and veggies. In addition to our planned speaker, also attending the meeting was Lion Shravan Shivangi who recently moved to Ashburn and plans to transfer his Lion membership to our Club.

Past Council Chair Harry Parker - another about-to-transfer - was also present.

Our speaker was Dr Matthew Levy on the topic of "Stop the Bleeding." Matthew chairs the STB Coalition, is on the staff at Johns Hopkins and is an Associate Professor



of Emergency Medicine. We learned that 35% of pre-hospitalization deaths occur due to bleeding out, and the need for bystanders to ACT QUICKLY to stop bleeding. We learned about putting pressure on the wound, applying tourniquets, and "packing a wound" with gauze treated with a hemostatic agent. Matthew urged all to: Get Kits (first aid kits with the materials

to stop bleeding), Get Trained, and Get Involved, and showed us a short training video. Read more about STB Coalition https://stopthebleedingcoalition.org/


A few notes from the Board meeting:

### **Lions Information - Visitation**

King Lion Karen asked that our newsletter include "visitation guidelines" for Lions year 2018-19. You may ask, What is visitation? Well, it is not fund raising and it is not service, but it is something clubs are encouraged to do...visit other Lions clubs to get ideas, and to meet other Lions. Believe it or not, making visits is actually a criterion for a club to receive awards. So here is what is new in visitation guidelines:

- "Clubs will be self-reporting and will only report once at the end of the Lion year. This means that you will not have to fill out a visitation form. You do need to tell me (visitation chair for District 24-L) when you visit the name of the club you visited, the date of the visit, and who in the club participated in the visit. You do not need to record mileage."
- "Clubs with less than 30 members need only one member to visit to get credit for a visit. Clubs of 30 or more members require two members to get credit for a visit. However, if the visit is over 50 miles, only one Lion is required to visit regardless of the size of our club."
- "Under 24L there will be two types of awards:
- -- Participation. All clubs that make 12 or more visits and visit all clubs in their Zone will receive a participation award. This is the goal we have had and met this year.
- --Governor's Award. The club making the most visits in the Small (less than 30 members) and Large (30 or more members) will receive the Governor's award."

Your newsletter editor got an email from "Wreaths Across America," the group that puts wreaths in Veterans Cemeteries at Christmas. The email had a link to a video about the wreaths, featuring a **special person**. That special

person is aging now, and is suffering from Parkinson's.
