The guest speakers were Abby and Tejas, representing the "Borgen Project." The Borgen Project believes leaders of the most powerful nation on earth should be doing more to address global poverty. It serves as an innovative, national-level campaign to make poverty a focus of US foreign policy. The Borgen Project web page: https://borgenproject.org/about-us/

Abby and Tejas told us about world poverty: that 689 million persons around the world (10% of the world's population) live in extreme poverty - that is, exist on less than \$1.90 per person each day. And, 2/3's of those are children. The Borgen Project tries to make a difference by focusing political attention on the situation.




