In case you missed the email from Lion Jeff: Lion Pete Conklin received the following notification from Lion Ron Zabel (forwarded with Ron's permission):

Marilyn appreciated the birthday wishes from the Lions. A bright spot in current circumstances. While we were traveling in Iceland in late June, Marilyn became ill and came home early. The next day in the ER, we received hard news. Marilyn has acute onset of AML Leukemia - her white count had shot up to over 350, nearly 100 times normal. She was hospitalized for 16 days from June 28th, starting her first chemo infusion cycle. She was out for about two weeks and then back in again on August 5th with

Covid. Another 17 days in the hospital, and back home now. She starts her third chemo infusion cycle tomorrow. All the hospitalizations have left her very weak, and she can't get around on her own. I am pretty much her full-time caregiver at this point. I'm pretty disconnected from everything and will be for a while. Lion Ron Zabel

We keep Marilyn, Lion Ron, and their family in our thoughts and prayers.


"Nonprofits Scramble for Help Amid Dearth of Volunteers"

What's Up With the Name "October?"


The month October's name stems from the Latin octo ("eight") because it was the 8th month of the early Roman calendar. When the Romans converted to a 12-month calendar, the name October stuck despite the fact that it's now the 10th month.

The second Monday in October (October 9th this year) is known for two celebrations: Columbus Day (a national holiday), and Indigenous Peoples' Day — a holiday in many states that celebrates the history and cultures of indigenous peoples native to what is today the US. Indigenous Peoples' Day is celebrated in cities and states across the country, often alongside or in lieu of Columbus Day.

The other well known day in October is Halloween on the 31st.

The last 2-3 weeks in October (and sometimes part of November) is normally the only time when all "Big 4" US professional sports schedule games; the NBA begins preseason, the NHL is about 1 month into its regular season, the NFL is about halfway into its season, and MLB is in postseason.

Who Is This?



This is a photo of a face we all have seen, although probably not up-close. Can you guess whose face it is? In 1889, packing crates were shipped across the Atlantic ocean - containing a gift to the United States from the people of France. The crates were opened, and their contents assembled into what has become a very well known copper statue built by Gustave Eiffel.



The statue is a figure of Libertas, the Roman Goddess of Liberty. She holds a torch above her head with her right hand, and in her left hand carries

a tabula ansata inscribed JULY IV MDCCLXXVI (July 4, 1776 in Roman numerals), the date of the US Declaration of Independence. A broken chain and shackle lie at her feet as she walks forward, commemorating the national abolition of slavery following the American Civil War. After its dedication, the statue became an icon of freedom and of the United States, recognized around the world as a symbol of the US, and a symbol of welcome to immigrants arriving by sea.
