Eyeglass Recycling

On June15th, the NoVA Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center provided our club with 9 boxes (about 450 pair) of reading glasses that we provided to The Lamb Center for their "Guests." For a special need, reading glasses can be a cherished gift. The Guests needing them are given choices of style and color; volunteers help select correct strength.

Last year, the Eyeglass Recycling Center distributed 35,000 pairs of re-purposed prescription and reading glasses for use on medical mission trips to very poor countries. 35,000 is the historical annual average, and our club provides a good number of those from our collection boxes.

<u>Update on NEW Eyeglass Recycling Center</u>

As described above, the NoVA Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center processes donated eyeglasses for use by medical teams around the world. District 24L

has been searching for a suitable replacement space for the **Eyeglass Recycling Center** now located at 919 South Monroe Street, Arlington, VA.

A recent email from Lion Pam Martinov, who leads Lions Eyeglass Recycling in NoVA: "We do have progress on a new center. It will be a different set up, but workable. We will have a small room and largish closet as dedicated space at the Mason District Government Center on Columbia Pike. Those rooms open up into a very large room that we can reserve for use for sorting or "reading" glasses. It will be similar to how we operated from 2021-2023 before the house was renovated and we did most of our work at the Woodrow Wilson Library. We also plan to have a trailer in the parking lot for boxed glasses and supplies. We will need to be flexible. The price is right - \$0 - and we will have pretty good visibility in the community. I think we will move over the summer. Stay tuned!"

The address for that new center: 6507 Columbia Pike, Annandale. The dedicated space will be small, but adjacent space is suitable for volunteers to perform various functions necessary to process used eyeglasses. Lion Marty Lockard suggests: we may have an opportunity for club members to periodically go there and process donated eyeglasses - like we've done in the past.

New Facility at NoVA Lions Youth Camp

On June 8th, the Northern VA Lions Youth Camp dedicated the new, recently completed "Arcola Learning Center." This addition to Youth Camp facilities is designed to provide a classroom style learning environment for youth - as well as adult - campers.

If you were around on the 20th anniversary of D-Day (June 6, 1964) you may have seen Walter Cronkite interview President Dwight D Eisenhower. On June 6, 1944, General Eisenhower was the Commander of the Supreme HQ Allied Expeditionary Force and led the largest naval, air and land operation in history.
