#### Contd - 2 things FHLC members can do NOW...

(2) Save plastic bags. Huh - what's that all about? We are reacting to "citrus greening" - the disease is not going away, and the grower has informed us NO Navel Oranges are available this year. So, we will sell half-cases of Mandarin oranges (as we usually do), and also full-cases, and BAGS of 20 mandarins. We will ask club volunteers working

in the fruit sale van, to break down full cases of mandarins into bags of 20 mandarins - we expect those will sell quickly, both pre-orders and walk-up orders! We used to do that several years ago, and now return to the practice to help compensate for not having navel oranges to sell.

So, WE NEED PLASTIC BAGS - a lot of them (we hope to sell several hundred "bags of 20").

Your help? When you come home from the grocery, home depot, or have a carry-out meal, etc, SAVE THE PLASTIC BAG. We ask you to hold on to the bags until the fruit sale, then bring them to the sales van on Wednesday night (the unload night), or hand them off to a fruit sale team member if you cannot make it Wednesday night. Thank you!



#### **Dinner Meeting - Aug 20th**

The speaker (your newsletter editor) talked about Army shoulder patches. A few of the slides shown:



The first US Army unit shoulder patch (81st Infantry Division) was approved during WWI by General Pershing, who charged all units to have their own patch. Unit patches are a symbol of honor, pride, and identity. They distinguish soldiers from one another and show their unit affiliation. Each patch is unique to a particular unit and has its own story - often reflected in symbology on the patch.

The fruit sale committee reported: the Florida vendor contacted us, to report that navel oranges will no longer be available due to continued issues with poor quality navel oranges resulting from the "greening" disease that is now persistent across the state. Our vendor has gotten rid of their navel orange groves. The committee has decided not to risk selling questionable quality fruit we might be able to find from a new FL vendor. Result: our 2024 fruit sales will drop navel oranges and sell Mandarins and Ruby Red Grapefruit which are consistently good quality, along with VA peanuts and VT maple syrup. And, we will sell peanuts-in-shell (new item).


#### **Surplus Equipment**
